INTRODUCTION AND UPDATE

Welcome to our May 2024 Newsletter. We hope that you find the information useful, and please let us know if there are any topics you would like to see in future newsletters from the Practice.

Demand on GP Practices across the country remains extremely high. BMA figures indicate that General Practice now offers an average of 1.4 million appointments daily, the equivalent of half of England's population having an appointment every single month.

Here at Parish Fields in March, the average number of appointments was 240 per day, with our Reception team answering over 3,500 telephone calls during the month. At peak times we have recently seen incoming telephone call volumes at 100 per hour.

On working days, the "Appointments" section of the website also links to a form where patients can request advice/book an appointment. This form usually opens at 6am and we aim to keep this form open until 10.30am. After that, urgent (non-emergency) requests can still be raised by telephoning our Reception Team.

The Practice continues to offer additional clinics until 8pm on most Mondays along with periodic Saturday clinics.

Our Nursing Team have been very busy with the Spring Covid-19 vaccinations in April, initially for care home residents and housebound patients, with immunisation clinics for qualifying patients being scheduled during May. Full details on qualifying patients can be

In summary, with continued volumes of requests for same day care and support, each day we have to balance the demand appointments and access via our website whilst ensuring that our clinician's workload enables them to deliver safe clinical care.
